- Submissions are open for UK and International films.
- Academy Award, BAFTA & BIFA qualifying festival.
- Submissions will close on 31st May 2019.

Raindance Film Festival invites UK and International producers and filmmakers to submit their films to its 27th edition that will take place from 25 September to 6 October 2019 in central London (Piccadilly / Leicester Square).

The Raindance Film Festival aims to show the very best in new cinema from the UK and around the world and specialises in first-time directors and discovery.

Submissions are open for: Narrative Feature, Documentary Feature, Narrative Short, Documentary Short, Animation Short, Music Video, Queer (feature and shorts), VR/AR Experience and Web Series.

Competitive Strands

For the competitive feature films strand at Raindance, films will compete for: Film of the Festival, Best UK Feature, Best International Feature, Best Director, Best Screenplay, Best Cinematography, Best Performance, Best Documentary Feature, Discovery Award, Short of the Festival, Best UK Short, Best Documentary Short, Best Animation Short, Best Music Video to recognize achievement for the most innovative talent and films that challenge the boundaries of filmmaking.

A separate jury will judge the WebFest and VR/AR nominees. All selected WebFest series will compete for an Audience and a Jury Award. VR/AR nominees will compete for: Best Interactive Narrative VR Experience, Best Animation VR Experience, Best Cinematic VR Experience, Best Documentary VR Experience, Best Social Impact VR Experience, Best Music VR Experience, Best Multi-Person VR Experience, British Award: Best UK VR Experience, Discovery Award: Best Debut VR Experience, and Grand Jury Prize: Best Immersive Story.

Qualifying Festival: Academy Award, BAFTA and BIFA

Raindance Film Festival is officially recognised by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences USA, the British Academy of Film and Television Arts and the British Independent Film Awards in the following categories:

The Winner for the Best Short will qualify for Oscar®; films in the Best UK Short category will qualify for BAFTA nominations. In addition, British short films that play in competition and all British features that play in 2019 will be eligible for entry for the 2019 BIFA.

Queer Section

Raindance will recognise feature films, narrative or documentary, with a theme or story related to the Queer community from UK and around the world.

Virtual Reality and Raindance Web Festival

Raindance opens submissions for Virtual Reality/360 and web series aimed to promote and foster that next generation and network them with the online video industry.
